Attending Concerts

Concerts begin at 8:00 p.m. and last about one hour. Tickets will be honored <u>until 7:45 p.m.</u> at which time stand-by guests will be admitted as seating allows. Parking and traffic can be a concern, so <u>come early</u> to avoid delays.

- No smoking is allowed in the building or on the grounds.
- Generally concerts are for ages eleven years and older.
